and visitors hands in and around the Castro. We want to do more and will be organizing the following soon:

1. A **community self-defense seminar** to provide information on general safety and talk specifically about disaster safety, such as sudden fire, earthquake etc. Taught by black belt instructors from [Triangle Martial Arts Association](#) and officers from [Community Patrol USA](#) in association with CCOP and [SPI](#). (Date and time to be determined, sometime in early APRIL most likely. More details to follow.)
2. A **Secure Our Streets** effort – Saturday March 26 10am to 2pm in collaboration with [CP-USA](#), [CCOP](#), [SPI](#) and [San Francisco Safety Awareness For Everyone](#) to encourage the creation of **MORE** neighborhood and business watch programs all over the Castro and Duboce Triangle area. We will visit every doorstep in the neighborhood with fliers discussing how to set up a neighborhood or business watch – and with the help of SF-SAFE, we will help you establish and develop a watch program on your street. If you would like to volunteer to assist, please send us an e-mail and we'll send you more information.

In the mean time, please keep yourself, your family and your friends safe by following these simple safety steps :

- Ensure you have functioning smoke detectors and replace the batteries annually.
- Ensure you have an emergency evacuation plan for your building, and that your route is accessible and safe.
- Keep a sturdy pair of footwear under your bed, and something warm to throw on close by, just in case you have to leave extremely quickly and don't have time to "find something to wear."
- If you decide to try to fight a small fire, CALL 9-1-1 FIRST, then try to tackle the fire if you believe it is safe to do so. ALWAYS maintain an escape route in case the fire grows and you cannot contain it.
- Have an emergency contact plan that everyone in your household knows so you may re-connect after a disaster or emergency.
- If you live in an apartment building or condo, have a pre-designated assembly area so you can quickly determine if anyone may be left inside the building following an evacuation.

SFPD Mission Station Captain Greg Corrales hosts a monthly Community Meeting on the **last Tuesday of each month from 6pm to 7:00pm** at the Mission Station community room 630 Valencia Street. Get involved, become a part of the solution, and attend as many of these Community Meetings as you can.

Community Patrol USA promotes and provides information and assistance in the deployment of 5 major community safety and security programs for neighborhoods, in collaboration with other local and established resources:

1. **COMMUNITY SAFETY COLLABORATIVE (CSC) PROGRAM**
2. **NEIGHBORHOOD , BUILDING, BUSINESS WATCH (NBBW) PROGRAM**
3. **COMMUNITY ON PATROL SERVICE (COPS) PROGRAM**
4. **CRIME ACTIVITY REPORTING (CAR) PROGRAM**
5. **CRIME ALERT SYSTEM (CAS) PROGRAM**

Castro Community on Patrol (CCOP) founded in November 2006, is a grassroots non-profit organization dedicated to promoting safety and safety awareness in the Castro and Duboce Triangle neighborhoods. Our mission is to create a safer neighborhood for those who live in, work in, or visit the community in collaboration with community organizations, Patrol Special Police and the San Francisco Police Department. Anyone 18 and older is encouraged to join and participate in the basic patrol training class below. You are not obligated to patrol upon completion of the class, but will learn some really useful information during the class. If you wish to patrol, we ask for a minimum of 1x 3 hour patrol per month, though you may certainly do more if you have the desire and commitment.
