LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES AND COMMUNITY GROUPS COME TOGETHER TO COMBAT ROOFIED DRINKS, DATING/HOOKUP CRIMES AND TO ENCOURAGE MORE REPORTING OF INCIDENTS

LOCATION: MAGNET, 4122 18th Street (Between Castro St & Collingwood St)

The San Francisco District Attorney's office, the San Francisco Police Department, Safety Awareness For Everyone, Castro Community On Patrol, Community Patrol USA, and the Stop The Violence program will host a public information/press event to urge everyone to be cautious of "roofied" drinks and take some extra safety steps when meeting new people for dates or immediate hook-ups. We also want to encourage more reporting of such incidents to help law enforcement and community groups to help combat these crimes and bring those responsible to justice.

Please pass this on to anyone who may be interested and who may be able to attend. We will be promoting the following safety tips amongst other things:

AVOIDING ROOFIED DRINKS

- **DON'T** accept drinks from strangers unless you receive it directly from the bar staff.
- **DON'T** leave your drink unattended in a bar, club or other public location. Take it with you or if you do leave it for a time, buy yourself a new drink to avoid being drugged without your knowledge.

- **IF YOU FEEL UNUSUALLY UNWELL** after only one or two drinks, let the bar/club staff or your friends know and go to a safe and secure area immediately. Consider seeking medical attention if warranted.

DATING / HOOKUP SAFETY

- **SNAP A PICTURE** - of anyone you meet for the first time, and e-mail it to yourself or a trusted friend. Include the name and phone number of the person if you have it.
- **BE A BUDDY** – establish a buddy system with a trusted friend if you go home with someone you just met. Arrange to call or text them when you get there safely and do the same when you leave or the next day. Include the address and apartment number if you can. Do this for your own friends also.
- **STAY ALERT** – watch your friends and those around you, not in a creepy or paranoid way, but look out for each other and if you see anything suspicious or unusual, report it to bar staff, security staff, door staff or if you think it's needed – to police on the non-emergency 415-553-0123 or emergency 9-1-1 numbers.
- **DON'T GET WASTED** - if you go out to get wasted with friends, ensure those friends will get you home safe and sound. **DON'T** pick up a stranger when your wasted, and don't get wasted if you intend to go home with a stranger. You increase your risk tenfold by doing so.

REPORT ALL CRIMES & SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY TO SOMEONE

- **TRUST YOUR INSTINCTS** – If your instincts are telling you something isn't quite right, or things are just WAY too good to be true, **TRUST THEM**. It's better to miss something that may be pretty good occasionally, than to end up in a really horrible or life threatening situation that you may not walk away from.
- **REPORT** anyone who steals from you, assaults you, or abuses you in any way during a date or hook up. You may have gotten away relatively unharmed, but their next victim may not be so lucky. Your report could **SAVE A LIFE**.
- **SAFE REPORTING** – police can treat your report confidentially. If you feel uncomfortable reporting to police directly, contact Castro Patrol or Stop The Violence and we'll help or pass the information on for you while maintaining your anonymity.

Working together as a community, we can protect ourselves and our friends, we can keep the Castro a fun and safe place to live, work and play; and we can help to identify those who choose to target the Castro and ensure they are apprehended and brought to justice.

ADOPT A POLICE CAR – FUND AN AED – SAVE A LIFE!

**HELP THE S.F.P.D. TACKLE ANOTHER
KIND OF ARREST
“SUDDEN CARDIAC ARREST”**



The “Adopt A Police Car” program sponsored by SAFE aims to combat the nations #1 killer, claiming more than 450,000 lives annually, by placing Automated External Defibrillators (AED) in every neighborhood patrol police car within the city.

AED units are small, portable, and very easy to use by anyone, so they make a great deal of sense to have on board police vehicles, which are often the first emergency responders on scene. AED units can literally mean the difference between life and death for a sudden cardiac arrest victim and they form a significant part of the “chain of life” which includes Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and advanced medical care.

A study in King County, Washington, where AED’s were placed on board police vehicles and dispatched at the same time as Emergency Medical personnel found that a **67% survival rate** in sudden cardiac arrest victims was achieved, compared with a current **12% survival rate in San Francisco** and a 5% survival rate nationwide. That’s a big difference!

By donating towards the cost of an AED for your neighborhood police cruiser, or in general towards equipping all cruisers with an AED throughout the city, you could literally help to save a life, and perhaps your own or that of a loved one. Each AED costs approximately \$1,875.00 and donations of any amount are fully tax deductible.

CP-USA fully supports and recommends this program, and we’d like to partner with community organizations and businesses in collaboration with Safety Awareness For Everyone (SAFE) to get as many AED’s in as many patrol cars as possible.
