HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS	HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS The holiday season is a wonderful time for celebrations and sharing quality time with family and friends. It can also be a time when strangers are in our

neighborhoods as guests and visitors, and a time when we let down our guard a little and indulge a little too much. Some forethought and common sense can keep the holiday season fun, festive and safe for all.

- Test your smoke alarms and replace the batteries if needed. If you have a carbon monoxide alarm, check it too. If you have a fire extinguisher, check and service or replace it if needed.
- Keep the extinguisher, some damp cloths, oven mitts and pot lids handy when cooking those big family meals – just in case you need them quickly. Also, stay in the kitchen when cooking as most kitchen fires are the result of unattended cooking.
- Decorate your home with flame-retardant or non-combustible materials and take extra care with festive lighting to ensure it is in good working order and open flame candles to ensure they are stable, cannot be easily knocked over, and are not within reach of children or pets.
- If you are travelling to a holiday party, drink in moderation and either arrange for a designated driver, sober friends, public transportation or a taxi to get home afterwards.
- Leave absolutely nothing of irreplaceable value in your vehicle when parking during the holiday season. Take presents and valuables home before continuing to shop. It only takes a minute or two for an opportunistic car thief to break a window, pop a trunk and clean out a glove compartment.
- Let your neighbors know if you expect to be away for a few days, and if possible, have someone designated to drop in every day or so to check on things, pick up your mail and newspapers etc. Make sure they know how to get in touch with you if needed.
- If you are travelling for the holiday, plan and pack early to avoid stressing and rushing on the day of travel. If you're driving, have your vehicle serviced or thoroughly checked a few days before you set off. Carry an "emergency kit" just in case the worst happens and you are stranded for a couple of hours or more.
- If you take advantage of the post Thanksgiving day sales, take only the credit cards and cash you will need for the shopping trip. Stay alert to your surroundings and who is around you. Don't overload yourself with packages. Try to stay on well travelled and busier streets and areas.

- **Class Session #6...** Hands-On Training Skills Development and Application

If you are already a NERT, but your certification is not current, you may re-take any Class 5 and 6 to re-certify and obtain your new NERT ID.

The South Beach Community On Patrol Service (SB-C.O.P.S.) initiative is a non-profit group of unpaid volunteers who live, work, or play in the community and donate their time to walk, bicycle or drive in regular citizen safety patrols as an extra set of “eyes and ears” for law enforcement.

SB-COPS volunteers undergo a three hour training class and then join a volunteer patroller pool. You are notified of SB-COPS shifts by e-mail and can sign up to help out for part, or all of the shift time needed. SB-COPS provide a visible safety presence and also provide information, advice and act as ambassadors for the neighborhood. Any persons 18 years or older is eligible. SB-COPS do not break up fights or arrest people.
