**TIMELY TIPS FROM NERT NEIGHBORHOOD COORDINATOR,

**EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS**

**YEAR-END REMINDERS AND RESOURCES**

As we approach the end of another year, everyone is encouraged to review these **year-end reminders** in order to better prepare you, your family, and your household for any emergency, large or small.

- Make sure your **fire extinguisher is charged**. (There should be a pressure gauge that indicates if the extinguisher is fully charged or not.) If necessary, recharge or replace your extinguisher. Also, take this opportunity to review how to use it.
- **Replace the battery in your smoke alarm**. Check your flashlights or other items that require a replacement battery.
- **Review your (home, office, car) emergency kits**. Update anything that may require replacement (such as batteries, water packets). Any items need to be added? (Compare your kits to a neighbor's to see what may be missing.)
- Review your **supply of emergency (non-perishable) food and water**. Switch out any that have expired or are nearing their expiration date.
- Make sure your **emergency cash reserve** (stored somewhere in your home in a safe place) is intact. Do you have at least a few hundred dollars in small bills? (This is important to have as ATMs will not work during a power outage.)
- If you have not already done so, make **copies of important documents** (condo deed, insurance policies, will/living trust, etc). Keep these in a safe deposit box and/or with someone outside of the area.
- Review our **Building Evacuation procedures** to make sure everyone in your household is familiar with them. Practice an 'evacuation drill' from your condo unit and from the garage. Remember -- don't use the elevator for your drill.
- Have you prepared a **Family Plan**? Does each member of your household know where to find your emergency supplies? Have you picked a place to meet if you are separated? Do you have an out-of-town friend/relative that can be your main contact?
- Have you prepared a **Living Trust**? Have you discussed or already arranged **funeral / burial arrangements**? These costs are inevitable and can be costly if not arranged in advance. If you handle all the finances in your household, **does your spouse know all the account numbers, passwords, etc? Is his/her name on the account** in order to access said accounts in your absence?
